From the President

Two dramatic incidents early in the season - one involving a serious injury to our centre-half back Danny Leith and the other being the tragedy involving Birdwood player Antonio Loiacono in the Round 1 night game - have called on everybody associated with the club to pull together in the strongest possible fashion.

To the credit of all concerned players, coaches, volunteer staff, committee members and supporters - our club has shown enormous resilience. Naturally, our players and volunteer staff have been our focus and I am extremely proud of how we have worked through such difficult circumstances.

We have worked very closely with the Birdwood Football Club, the Hills Football League and the SANFL to ensure our club is getting the support it needs while assisting the Roosters to deal with their grief.

We have agreed with Birdwood and the Loiacono family to erect a plaque at the Western end of the ground under the big gum tree to recognise the tragedy.

Despite these incidents our teams have started the season really well with the As undefeated and showing great skill, courage and tenacity. I welcome all of the new players to our club such as Ben Biagi from Tanunda (son of 1980s premiership player Ralph) and Kyle Paech from Onkaparinga Valley as well as a number who have

returned many of whom played in colts teams previously. Let's not forget some who retired prematurely and some who left and quickly came back!

An area which has had significant media focus is concussion. We are at the forefront of concussion management in our chosen sport. Our work with NeuroFlex and the SANFL is leading the way not just for us but all amateur sporting clubs. We will continue to look after the health and wellbeing of our players as our first priority.

I hope to see you at our remaining matches as we push for another successful season.

I remind everybody that we are part of the Gumeracha community and we represent the community. Be proud of that! Play and barrack enthusiastically but with good grace and sportsmanship.

Concussion Management



For the second season in a row, Gumeracha Football Club undertook baseline concussion testing for all available players during the pre-season. Baselining will allow for scientific analysis of a player should they suffer a head injury during the season.

Baselining comprises a series of tests using virtual reality goggles. This method is far superior to the tradi-

tional SCAT questions asked of a which rely on subjective views.

While the AFL continues to dawdle on implementing scientific testing, we are working towards the best possible approach for pour players.

Discussion within the HFL is being undertaken with a view to establishing better procedures.

Life Members and Sponsors Day


Craig and Christine Jones put together a sumptuous lunch for about 40 life members and sponsors as part of Round 4.










Under 8s!




