#### Heritage Guernsey Presentation Night

Thursday, 28 April was a very eniovable night for many as our oldest Life Member and triple premiership player Dean Hanna, (93 years old) accompanied by us wife, Valda, presented the new heritage guernsey to all available players. A number of past players attended including 2019 premiership captain, Matt Armstrong and 1980s premiership players, John O'Dea and Lyall Fuller, both of whose fathers also played in Gumeracha premiership teams. Event coordinator, Tim Hanna explained the design of the new guernsey and its link to our first premiership team in 1922.

The guernseys include the years of each of our 16 premierships and the names of every known premiership player - 160 in all.



Of note was that, under the challenge rules of the era, Gumeracha played Tweedvale (Lobethal) three times to secure the J Hynes premiership cup!

The guernseys have been enthusiastically received by the

players and many supporters have asked if they can purchase one.

#### **ANZAC** Round under new lights a great spectacle

Hybrid-Ag Gumeracha Ovalwas lit up for our traditional ANZAC match against Kersbrook on Saturday, 30 April.

Our new lights were given their first full test and, by all accounts, came up trumps.

In addition to the financial contribution from the Gumeracha Football Club, the South Australian Government provided \$95,700 towards the project via an Infrastructure Projects grant. This was supported by the Adelaide Hills Council (\$20,000) and the Gumeracha Sporting Club (\$10,000).

The efforts of John O'Dea and Mark Gevers to provide an optimal spectator experience for night games was very much in evidence with all parts of the ground receiving adequate lighting while ensuring there was no spill into the local neighbourhood.



The players debuted the new heritage guernseys on a warm and still night. After the ANZAC commemoration ceremony, former wellknown player Peter Coad tossed the coin. Peter's grandfather, Wally Coad, served with the 3rd Light Horse Regiment during World War I and was a regular member of pre-war Gumeracha football teams.

It was a typically tough match against Kersbrook but we ran out comfortable winners 14.12 (96) to 9.2 (56) to take out the Maczkowiack Cup.

The RSL Spirit of ANZAC medal for the most courageous player was awarded by the Gumeracha RSL Subbranch Vice-President and former Birdwood premiership player. Мr Malcolm Herrmann, to Sam Hanna. Mrs Denia Neindorf, daughter of former Kersbrook and Gumeracha player and coach, Milton Maczkowiack, presented the Maczkowiack Cup to the Gumeracha team.

#### Maczkowiack Cup

The Mt Gould Cup was instituted in 1999 to mark the string and traditional rivalry that exists between the two local neighbouring Adelaide Hills owns.

Mt Gould is the prominent hill North of Gumeracha which dominates the mountain range that separates Gumeracha from the dark side!

Renamed the Maczkowiack Cup after the passing of Milton Maczkowiack in 2016, Kersbrook did not lose a



match when competing for the cup from its inception to 2019.

After playing a few matches for West Torrens, Milton Maczkowiack had a long and illustrious football career in country South Australia. He settled with Kersbrook until 1967 when he transferred to Gumeracha taking the Magpies to a drought-breaking premiership in 1970.

Milton was revered for his nurturing of junior players, a number of whom played for West Torrens in various grades, most notably, lan 'Scruff 'Hanna.


## **Umpires wanted!**
